Hebrew reading:

This year, each child has worked so hard to improve fluency as we asked every child to read for at least 5-10 minutes each day. Math

The Akiva math program is a balance of teaching conceptual understanding and procedural accuracy. Each grade level has certain concepts as well as procedures and math facts that they are responsible for teaching. Second graders should enter the class already knowing all of their addition and subtraction up to 10+10, automatically. In second grade, they will learn addition and subtraction facts up to 20+20. It is vital that students know all the facts in order for them to be successful with the new concepts and procedures that they will learn next school year. Students do have a summer slide if they do not practice, so please encourage your child to practice math facts for a few minutes each day. The practice will definitely pay off!
